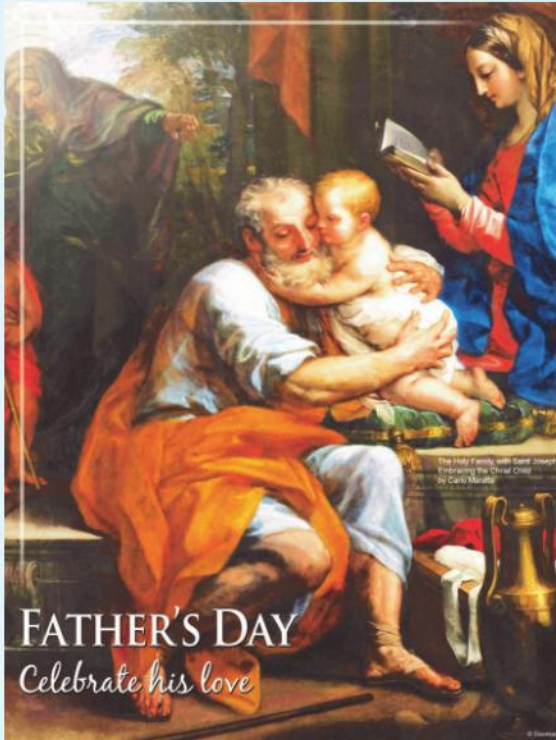

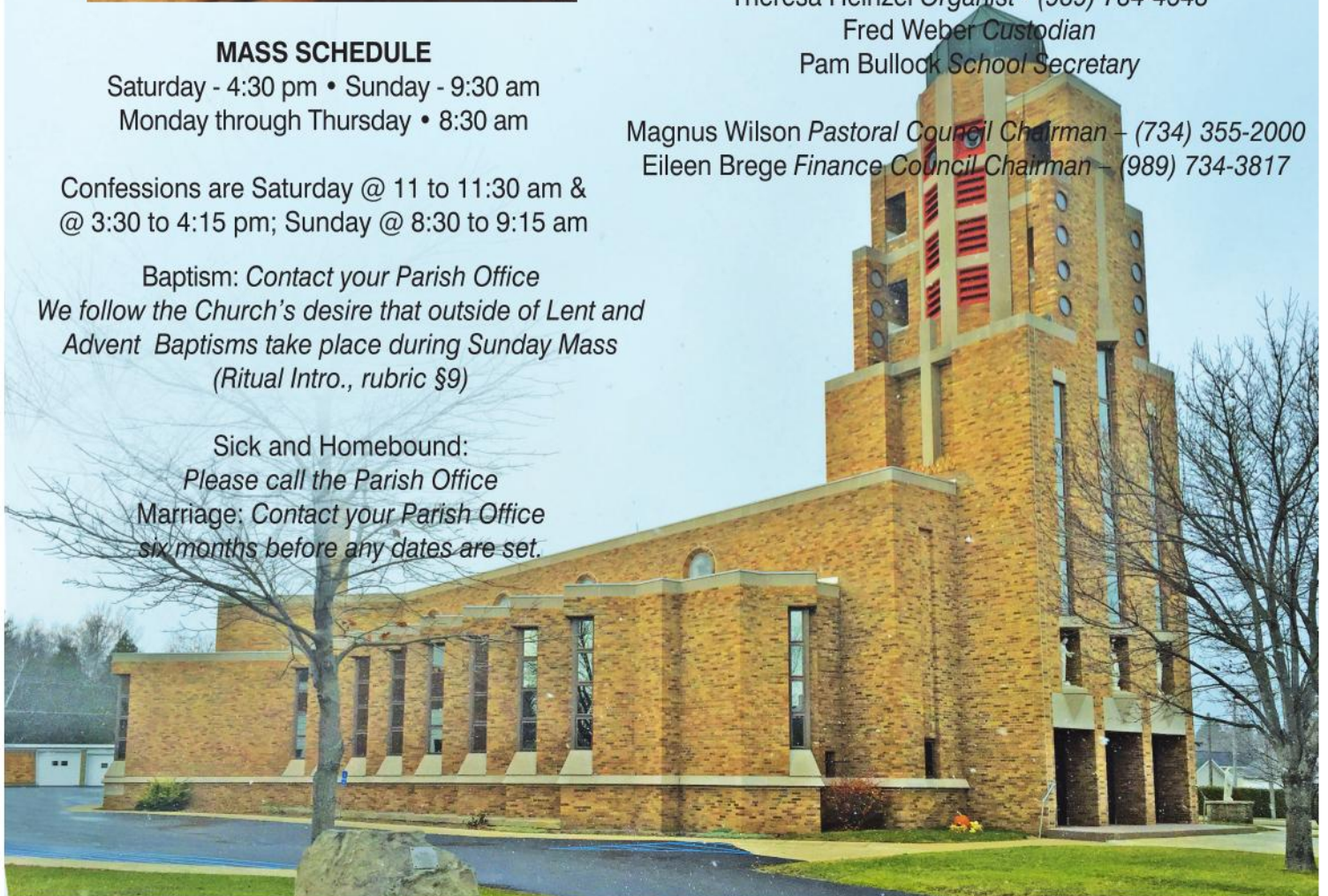

2020-21 CSA KICK-OFF!

Today St. Ignatius Parish begins our campaign for the 2020 Catholic Services Appeal. This is an opportunity for us to unite with all Catholics in the diocese and in the universal church to share our blessings and to show our care for one another. The CSA provides the opportunity to act together as a family and support programs and services no single individual or parish could offer by itself. Your gift is very important. Every gift, regardless of the size, is vital to the success of the Appeal, so please be as generous as possible with your pledge.

Funeral Masses and Luncheons

It has been brought to my attention that several families for various reasons want to postpone the Mass and burial until there can be a luncheon in the hall. I would like to call upon a few examples of parishioners who have opted for the funeral rites to be conferred on their deceased family members in ways which conduct the corporal work of mercy of burying the dead and the guardianship of the safety of all through a closed or limited-attendance Mass, for which a family determines the people who are invited.

Most funerals in which I have participated since being with you are attended by couples or families from the same households, which increases in a reasonable manner the number of people we can have for a closed Mass. Also, my experience of funeral Masses at St. Ignatius of Loyola church is that most of the time, fifty or so had been the number of people who would participate in an open funeral Mass before the public health emergency. In those instances, the fifty or so would encompass the family, extended family, parishioners and persons from the community and elsewhere. This is true even in instances when the family expected a large number of participants.

Even for what is very likely to be a very large funeral, I urge you to consider the closed funeral Mass. As our experience in the last several weeks indicates, many of our parishioners are not yet comfortable returning to Mass under the current state and diocesan conditions. This significantly reduces the number of people who attend weekend Masses, and would likely reduce the number of people attending a funeral.

Even though we celebrate a funeral Mass now, during the public health emergency, the luncheon does not have to be the same day as the Mass. We can work with families to have the luncheon on a day in the indefinite future when such functions are again permitted in the hall. Some families more recently have chosen to provide for their own luncheons at home for smaller segments of the Mass participants.

As Catholics, we follow the teaching of Holy Mother Church that the primary purpose of the funeral, particularly the Mass, is "expressing efficacious communion *with the deceased* at the participation in that communion of *the community* gathered for the funeral and to the proclamation of eternal life to the community" (*Catechism* §1684). Since the earliest days of the Church, Catholic custom has been to celebrate the Mass of Christian burial as closely as possible to the date of someone's death, for the benefit of the soul of the beloved decedent. The Eucharistic sacrifice is the most esteemed and meritorious way for praying for the dead. The Mass directly unites us to the Paschal Mystery of Christ, which by the Holy Spirit, unites the living and the dead (*Catechism*, §1330, 1371, 1683, 1689). By this means, we let God provide the healing to our dearly departed as soon as possible, and can be consoled as soon as possible by our sustained bond in Christ with the deceased when we are most acutely affected by the death of a dear one.

I give my thanks to the families who during this health emergency have exemplified giving priority to the timely corporal work of mercy for their beloved dead of having a funeral Mass, and pray that we keep making the souls of our dead the primary consideration when we are faced with preparing family members' funerals.
